AIGA

Student group dedicated to KCAI's chapter of the professional organization for design.

ArtPlay

ArtPlay is a student organization that marks the intersection of art and social action. Participants build creative skills and social awareness in the community. ArtPlay students engage people, direct projects, organize and manage volunteers and find funding to support their vision. ArtPlay members volunteer the number of hours their academic schedule permits. ArtPlay projects have included Home Grown, HALO, Alternative Means and the Free Water Campaign, as well as art projects with and for residents of the Rose Brooks Center, a domestic abuse shelter for women and their children.

Artspace Advisory Council

The Artspace Advisory Council is a group of ambitious students who act as collaborative liaisons between the ArtSpace staff and the student body. As an intermediary group, ASAC creates meaningful projects, interactions, and dialogue for the student body using the Artspace's resources and programs focusing on topics relevant to contemporary art practice.

Animation Club

To act as a center for community and collaboration within the Animation Department and to allow a place to gather and share resources related to animation.

Asian Culture Organization

It serves as a liaison between students and administration, giving students of color a voice on issues that are most pressing to them and serving as a resource to ensure that the social, cultural and educational needs of students are met.

Student Activists for Equality (SAFE) is a student-led organization in Kansas City, Missouri whose goal is to educate, promote political awareness, and inspire people to stand up for human rights. The organization's primary focus is LGBTQUA + equality.

Students for Sustainability

Students for Sustainability aims to bring awareness to the roles of consumption and ethics play in our KCAI community and how we can facilitate mindful practices within our studios. The organization's focus is on fiber processes and the waste they produce, such as fabric scraps and water from dye processes. Additionally, they will broaden the conversation to a global scale and facilitate discussions around the problematic aspects of fast fashion and the garment industry, and will take action and address changes mainly in the community and in their studio practices. During biweekly meetings, the organization will have guest speakers who use sustainable practices in their studios.
